# CORN BELT ENERGY CORPORATION RETURNS AS NATURAL GAS PURCHASER

IMGA is pleased to announce that Corn Belt Energy Corp has signed a one year contract and will begin purchasing gas on May 1, 2008.

Corn Belt Energy Corp, with main offices located in Downs Crossing, serves both residential and commercial customers in Northern and Central IL, providing both electrical and natural gas services. Established in 1938, Corn Belt Electric Cooperative's main objective was to provide electrical services to farmers in the McLean County area. In 1999, Corn Belt Electric Cooperative merged with Illinois Valley Electric Cooperative out of Princeton to form Corn Belt Energy Corp. Since their merger, Corn Belt Energy has grown to provide energy to more than 30,000 customers in 18 counties in IL.

Corn Belt Energy Corp previously purchased natural gas from IMGA during the 2002 to 2006 period. We welcome them back to the Agency!

## MUNI-BONDS HAVE NOT BEEN THIS LOW SINCE THE LATE 1800s

Municipal bonds have not been as cheap as they are today since the 1860s and 1870s. Back then the causes were Civil War difficulties and railroad excesses. Per an analyst from J.P. Morgan Securities Inc., today the cause is due to technical factors and liquidity drought in the debt market. The following is an excerpt from "US Fixed Income Markets Weekly" provided by J.P. Morgan Securities Inc.:

The municipal market had indeed been a very quiet area until February, when a massive failure of the ARS market brought it to the center of the financial entropy. The resulting eye-poppingly high ratios, TOB unwinding, and large involvement of nontraditional investors are only some of the consequences. More structural changes are to be expected, which may take years to come.

On the issuers' side, the near—to intermediate-term effort will be concentrated on restructuring of ARSs and some VRDOs as the high-single-digit yields continue to bite into their financial positions. At the same time, as housing prices continue to move lower and the economy slips into a recession, budget conditions in the state and local governments are expected to deteriorate, which should be more visible later this year. The role of bond insurers should continue to wane, especially as rating agencies are mulling over the plan to assign global credit ratings to municipal bonds. As liquidity cost increases and ratios stay high for a prolonged period of time, issuers may increasingly lean toward fixed coupon bonds.
